Quaker Studies is multi-disciplinary and inter-disciplinary. It feeds into and from theology, history, philosophy, politics, sociology, anthropology, womens studies, peace studies, literary studies and cultural studies.

*Quaker Studies* is the only fully-refereed journal in this field. It is published twice a year, drawing on the best of international scholarship across these disciplines, frequently in semi-themed issues, eg Quakers and Peace, Quakers and business, Quakerism and popular culture, Quaker women.

You can subscribe by joining the Quaker Studies Research Association (QSRA).

QSRA, formed in 1992 and with an international membership of around 300, is the umbrella organisation for all those studying, teaching, researching or connected with research into one of the areas of Quaker Studies. It holds an annual conference, hosts the George Richardson Lecture, oversees the David Adshead Award for new postgraduates, and publishes a Research Register each year.

Individual membership rates are £12/ \$20pa for those with an income of less than £11999pa/ \$17,999, £22/ \$35 for those with an income greater than £12000pa/ \$18,000. The rate for Quaker Meetings and FAHE Institutions is £22/ \$35. Institutional rates are £50/ \$80.
